District 1 Development & News

Loomis Road Crossing

The Greenfield Common Council approved creating a tax incremental financing district for the 44.1-acre area near West Loomis Road, Interstate 894 and West Layton Avenue. The council also signed a development agreement with Milwaukee-based Cobalt Partners. Most of the land near Starbucks on 43rd & Loomis Rd, towards 35th Street & Layton Ave has been cleared to begin development on the main apartment complex, as well as supporting businesses. As of November 2022, there is the potential of the need to establish a second TIF district to finance this project.

Honey Creek Restoration

The City of Greenfield is moving forward with a project along the Honey Creek that will reduce flooding, enhance plant and animal habitat, improve water quality, and provide new passive recreational opportunities for park users. With the assistance of our grant funding partners, we will be able to reduce flooding, restore the creek to its natural condition, and provide a new park amenity for our residents.

Powerline Trail

Development regarding the Powerline Trail is continuing via various grant programs. The first trail portion has been completed from HWY100, working east to 60th Street.

Home of the Knockout Rose

Did you know that Greenfield was officially declared the Home of the KnockOut® Rose? The KnockOut® Rose was developed by a long time Greenfield resident. Mayor Neitzke and a committee of city officials had named Greenfield as the “Home of the KnockOut® Rose”.

Now known for its beauty, disease and pest-free qualities, it has become famous as one of the top favorites of gardeners. The KnockOut® series is sold worldwide. Stay tuned to see our city logo be updated over time with this wonderful news.

New Sculpture for City Hall

We are proud and excited to announce that the Greenfield Beautification Committee is donating a fabulous sculpture, “Stars on the Wind”, which will grace City Hall in the future. The work, selected after a year-long search, was created by Richard Taylor, a well-known Milwaukee artist and sculptor. Watch for news of the installation this spring.

Election & Ward Changes post 2020 Census

The City of Greenfield received notification on March 17, 2022 that the City was impacted by new congressional maps that were provided to the Wisconsin Election Commission. The report showed new congressional district lines changes in our municipality as a result of the redistricting. The City had completed the city and county portions but the congressional redistricting changed the maps. This new plan will add three wards in Aldermanic District 1, which will be in Congressional District 4 and the rest of the City will be in Congressional District 5. The plan is to keep Wards 1, 2, 3, and 4 numbered as they are, and the three new wards will be numbered as Wards 5, 6, and 7, causing all the other wards to be renumbered throughout, going up to Ward 25.
